

Safe Snowmobiling

- Never consume alcohol or drugs before or during snowmobiling.
- Become familiar with the snowmobile you ride.
- Operate at safe and responsible speeds.
- Stay on trails and areas where snowmobiling is permitted.
- Avoid travel on unfamiliar frozen bodies of water.
- Use extra caution at night.
- Keep your snowmobile properly maintained.
- Listen to the weather forecast before you leave.
- Always wear a helmet and proper clothing.
- Never ride alone, let someone know where you are going and when you plan to return.
- Carry emergency supplies and learn survival skills.
- Be aware of where fuel stops are along your planned route.

Border crossing hours may change at any time. Please check with the Border Information Service (BIS). You can call the BIS at 800-461-9999 from within Canada, or 204-983-3500 or 509-636-5064 from outside the country. The call center is only open 8 am to 4 pm CST.

Snowmobilers crossing the border into the United States or Canada without FIRST reporting to an open port of Entry for inspection are subject to possible arrest, fines of up to \$5000 and/or the loss of their snowmobile.

Please ensure that you have the proper documentation for border crossing.

Free Ride Weekend

The organization has a reputation for promoting snowmobile safety by offering online courses and workshops, and also assists with protecting the environment. Our clubs care about the environment and are active players in sustainability. Snowmobilers embrace ecologically friendly policies from recycling and clearing the trails, to the adoption of new technologies.

To access Snoman trails during the weekend you must visit www.snoman.mb.ca to register and a temporary permit will be emailed to you. To access Snoman trails, this Weekend Trail Pass must be downloaded to your phone or affixed to the sled to which it is assigned.

If the pass is printed it must be and remain clear and legible for the duration of its usage.

You must show proof of ownership and a valid registration from Manitoba Public Insurance or another jurisdiction that includes a minimum of \$500,000 third-party liability coverage.

Any sled on Snoman trails without a permit is illegal and the operator can be subject a fine. Riders must follow all the rules and assumptions for safe Snoman trail riding.
